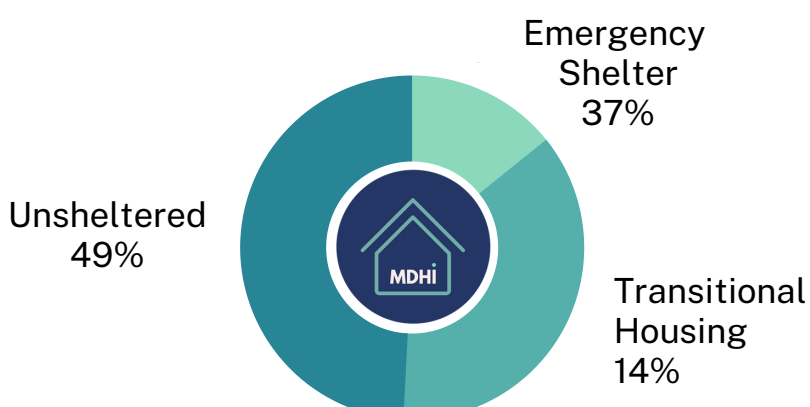

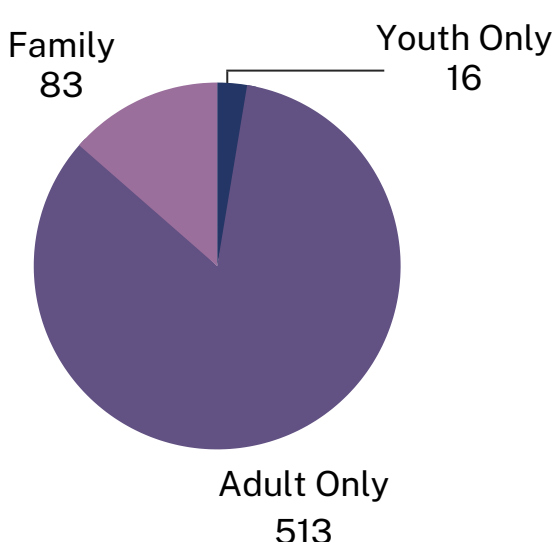

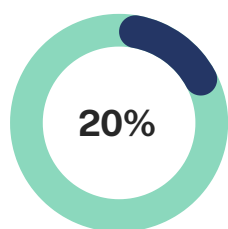

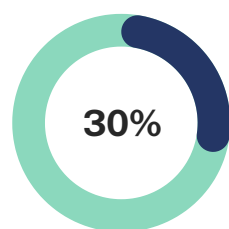
HOUSEHOLD TYPE

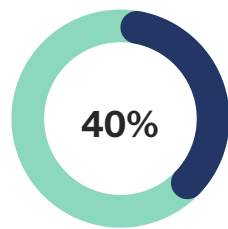

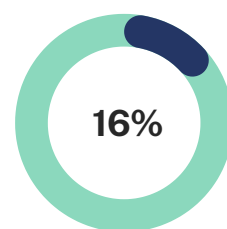

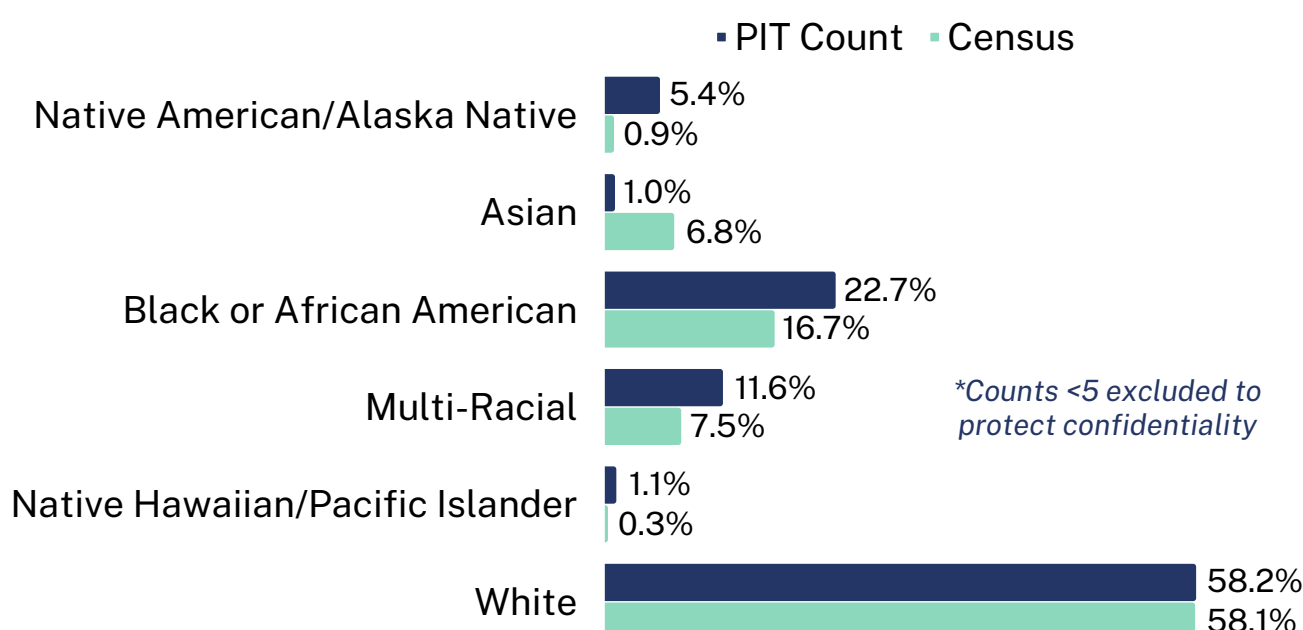

RACIAL DISPARITIES

Native Americans/Alaska Natives are overrepresented (6X) in homelessness relative to the general population in the City of Aurora. The same is true for those identifying as Black/African American (1.4X), Multi-Racial (1.5X), and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander (3.7X).
