The Aurora Youth Violence Prevention
Advisory Council provides paid youth
volunteer opportunities that aim to
decrease youth violence in Aurora by
advising city officials on programming
efforts, implementing youth-led strategies,
and ensuring youth voice is represented in
a multi-sector collaborative.

ADVISORY COUNCIL MISSION:

Members serve as key stakeholders who discuss, provide feedback and assist with program development and implementation to ensure that efforts are youth-informed to improve the delivery of services. Members seek to give a voice to other Aurora youth and offer awareness of real-life challenges, barriers and possible solutions to help support and empower others.

MEMBERS:

The Youth Violence Prevention Advisory Council is made up of youth between the ages of 14 – 24 who live or attend a school in Aurora.

COMMITMENT:

Members are asked to commit to a oneyear term and are incentivized based on the number of hours they contribute each month with a gift card. Members meet on a monthly basis and participate in activities, such as attending community events and participating in community service projects to ensure youth voice is represented.

RESPONSIBILITIES

PROGRAM ACTIVITY REPRESENTATION:

Based on availability, attend program activities meetings, community events and interviews, to provide a youth voice and representation.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

Support program engagement activities such as community events and assist with resource and program awareness efforts.

STAKEHOLDER COLLABORATION:

Work in coordination with program partners to support a collective approach and provide a youth perspective to stakeholders on different topics.


EDUCATIONAL SERIES:

Participate in a youth-specific educational series to increase awareness of youth violence prevention efforts and risk factors.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS:

Complete quarterly service jobs to increase community resiliency and quality of life as a primary prevention effort in targeted city hot spots identified by crime data.
