COMPONENTS OF A COMPUTER

Hardware - the computer machinery that allows use,, the stuff you can touch like the keyboard, mouse, printer, and monitor.


Software - programs that tell the computer what to do, the stuff you can't touch like internet browsers, word processors, and applications

Operating System - the basic coding that sends instructions from the programs, Windows XP, Mac OSx


OTHER KINDS OF COMPUTERS

HOW TO USE A MOUSE




- Put your pointer finger on the left button.
- Put your ring finger on the right button.
- Rest your wrist on the table.
- Keep your hand relaxed.
- Press the buttons gently without lifting your fingers.

THE DESKTOP




Maximize or Restore:
