

Welcome to APL: Using Libby

What is Libby?: Libby (formerly Overdrive) is an app that grants patrons access to APL's collection of eResources. Unlike Hoopla, which we subscribe to, APL owns these items the same we do physical copies you can check out and take home.






Why use Libby? Unlike Hoopla, there is not a limit to how many items can be checked out per month. However, like physical resources, APL owns Libby items on an individual basis. If APL only has 1 copy of an item, only 1 person can check it out at a time. This means you may encounter waitlists.

- **Libby is compatible with Kindle and Nook***
- *While Kindle is simple, transferring titles to a Nook-compatible format is considered advanced. If you are not comfortable with technology, reading in the Libby App may be a better option.





Connecting your Library Card

<p>Open your app and select Yes if you have your card*. On the next screen, select “Find Libraries Nearby”</p>	<p>Locate APL using a method of your choosing. Make sure to select the Aurora Public Library in Colorado, as there is also an APL in Illinois.</p>	<p>Sign in with your Card Number*.</p>



Managing Your Settings and Account

<p>Once you connect your card, you will be brought to your card management page.</p> <p>I recommend Renaming your card to the name of the primary cardholder or cardnumber</p> <p>To access this page otherwise, select the symbol with 3 lines at the bottom center, and then follow these steps</p>	<p>Selecting...</p> <p>Aurora Public Library will allow you to manage that card as in the previous step.</p> <p>Add Library will allow you to add a card from another library.</p> <p>Manage Cards will allow you to add additional APL cards (in case you get a new number or share a device with another cardholder)</p>
	





	<p>Copy to Another Device is not necessary for all users and is beyond the scope of this course.</p> <p>Accessibility Features gives you options to personalize your Libby experience (color and text variation, motion, vibrations, orientation) For more features, see pg. 7</p> <p>Read Books With... will allow you to set up your kindle as your preferred method. <u>The email linked to your Kindle/Amazon and library account should be the same.</u> Patrons may already have been prompted by the app to set this up.</p> <p>Manage Notifications allows you to personalize your notification preferences</p>
	<p>Change Download Rules allows you to specify how items download. This is useful if you are concerned about data usage or storage space on your device. <u>Kindle books</u> will need to be manually downloaded regardless.</p> <p>Customize Navigation is an advanced function not covered in this course. Refer to Get Some Help on the previous page for more info</p> <p><u>Choose Your Language</u> will change the language used in the Libby App, not <u>your books</u>. Foreign language books can be found using the search function.</p>

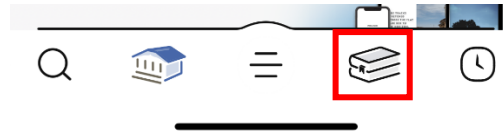
Searching for and Borrowing Items

<p>To Search for items, select the magnifying glass icon in the lower left.</p> <p>Use Filters to narrow your results by genre, format, availability, language, etc.</p>	<p>Type in your Keyword Search term. Keyword searches automatically include title, author, or series related terms. Note Filters again.</p>	<p>Once you have found your item, select Borrow or Place Hold. You may also try a Sample, or apply a Tag.*</p> <p>If you set up automatic downloads in settings, it will download.</p>

Your Shelf and Downloads

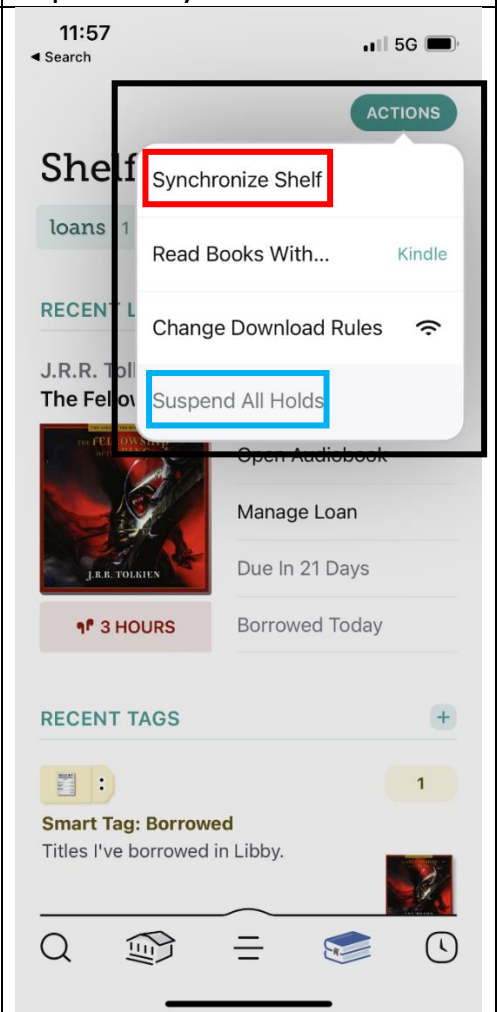
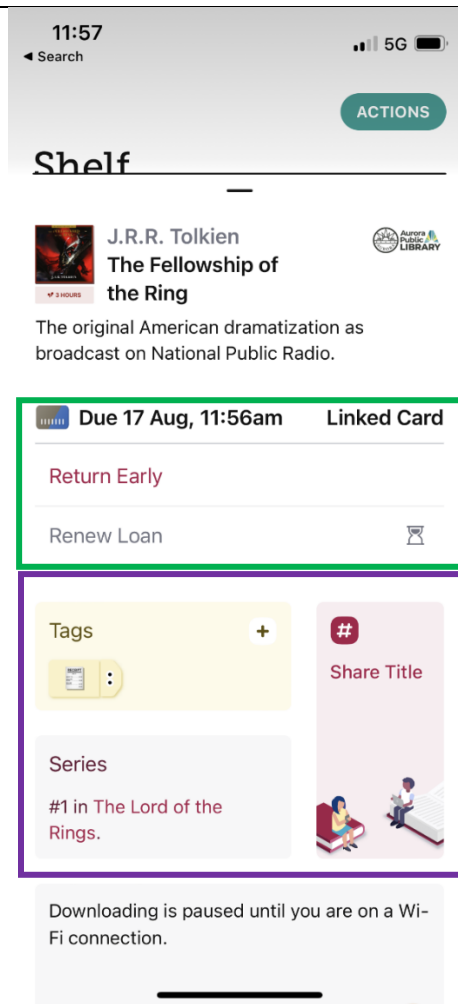
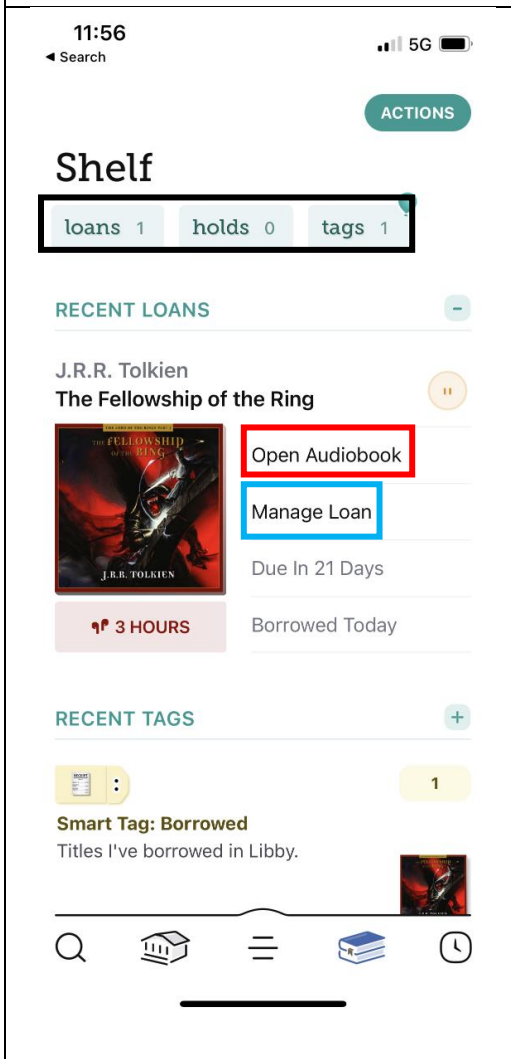
After borrowing an item, you may access **Your Shelf** using the following icon.



From your shelf, you will be able to view your **Loans, Holds,** and existing **Tags**. To access an item, select the **Open** option. Select **Manage Loans**.
















Manage Loans will allow you to **Return or Renew** items. It will also allow you to add **Tags, and Share** items with friends. These are best learned through experimentation.

Actions has 2 new functions to experiment with. **Synchronize** only applies if your accounts across devices do not match up. **Suspend All Holds** is self-explanatory.









